Comment

- 5 new cases were reported today. The latest 7-day rate for new cases is 22.1/100,000 population, up from 12 last week and 17 two weeks ago, but similar to three weeks ago (21). Positivity (the indicator of community transmission) is 2.4%, also up from 1.1% last week and 1.8% two weeks ago. Wrexham is 3rd in Wales for the rate per 100k, compared to 10th last week and 7th two weeks ago, and 2nd for positivity, compared to 11th last week and 9th two weeks ago.
- However, these remain the lowest figures since early September 2020 before the second wave of
 infections began, and lower than the old Welsh Government 'trigger points' for a lockdown or even
 'local measures'. Also, as can be seen from Table 2, below, this week's rise affects very few parts of
 Wrexham town and the rest of the County Borough has had no cases for weeks (reported as '0-2').
- The overall improvement over the last two months has been sustained despite the return of children to schools and a gradual relaxation of the Level-4 alert measures
- A cluster of cases associated with a food plant in Bala has affected some Wrexham residents
- There are no reported cases of 'variants of concern' ('India', 'Brazil', 'Bristol, 'Liverpool', etc.)
- Hospital admission and deaths are, thankfully, very low.

• 4 of the 18 sub-areas of the County Borough have more than 50/100,000 population – the old Welsh Government lockdown/local measures trigger – compared to 2 last week, but none has more than 8 cases. The rest, most likely, have not had any cases for several weeks (recorded by Public Health Wales (PHW) as '0-2 cases').

- These 4 sub-areas are in the worst decile (10%) in Wales (29.5/100k) compared to 3 last week:
 - o Caia Park: 56/100k (4 cases), up from less than 29 last week
 - o Hermitage & Whitegate: 91/100k (8 cases), up from 45/100k last week
 - Town North, University & Rhos-ddu: 56/100k (5 cases), up from less than 23/100k last week (it is noteworthy than none of these cases are actually in the university itself)
 - o Wrexham West: **72/100k** (6 cases), the same as last week
- **16** have seen their lowest rates during this week, since 20th October 2020 (when PHW first published these data), compared to 17 both last week and two weeks ago.
- 14 are in the lowest decile in Wales, compared to 15 last week and 16 two weeks ago.

MANAGING THE VIRUS

- Overall The Level-4 Alert lockdown, in place since 20 December 2020, but gradually relaxed since, comes to an end on Sunday. Wales will then go into Level-3, allowing gyms, leisure centres and some other venues to reopen and various indoor organised activities to resume. The First Minister will review the measure in two weeks and it is expected that, if cases continue to fall, Wales will shortly move into Level-2.
- **Council Services** the Council is continuing to provide all of its services, as publicised on our website, other than public access to most Council buildings.

The Vaccination Programme

General

- More than 584,000 doses have been administered in North Wales, compared to 550,000 last week
- Nearly 96,000 doses have been administered in Wrexham, compared to 88,000 last week
- Vaccine rollout continues through the Mass and Local Vaccination Centres and GP practices

Who are the health board vaccinating and how will they be contacted?

- This week and moving forward the Health Board (BCUHB) will be vaccinating the following groups:
 - People in Priority Groups 1-9 who were unable to receive their vaccination when it was first offered to them. This includes people aged 50+, people aged 16-64 with certain underlying health conditions, unpaid carers and those living with people who are immunosuppressed
 - o Priority Group 10 people aged 18-49 year olds
- Invitations will be sent by letter, text message and phone call.

AstraZeneca (AZ) or Pfizer vaccine?

- BCUHB is following the latest guidance from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) that the AZ vaccine should not routinely be given to those aged under 30. This means that two groups of Priority Group 10 (18-49 year olds) will be vaccinated concurrently, with two different vaccines: those aged 30-50, the AZ vaccine and those aged 18-29, the Pfizer one.
- Those aged 18-29 who have already had a first dose of AZ will have the second dose of that vaccine to complete their course.
- As BCUHB wishes to use vaccine supplies as quickly as they are received, this will inevitably mean that some under 30s will be invited before the 30-50 year olds have been completed. The only way to avoid this would be to hold back supplies of the Pfizer vaccine, which would be an unjustifiable risk.
