- Minera Community Council (MCC) met for a meeting on 1st December.
 The meeting covered outstanding general and project business. The main meeting took place on January 18th. Dates and agendas for all meetings are published in advance on the website.
- The Gwynfryn playground renovation is now complete. There will be a "formal" opening, involving young people and the Gwynfryn community at Easter time. Details will be publicised, and also available on the website
- The Youth Service in Minera on Tuesdays 6pm-8-pm at the restored container at the football field is providing a valued service, and is growing in numbers of young people attending.
- Cllr Jerry Wellens is following up the broken fence on Minera Hall road, and the return of the public computers at Coedpoeth library in Plas Pentwyn.
- The footpath committee has had confirmation from North Wales wildlife trust that they own the Berwig line footpath. The path may be closed for short periods from time to time while they work to improve biodiversity there.
- The community council budget for next year was thoroughly discussed, as we want to keep it as low as possible. We will continue to fund the playgrounds, youth service and school crossing patrol, all of which have benefit to the community. We will maintain funding to control knotweed in the quarry, and have a programme of repair and maintenance of the streetlights. The LED bulb replacement which we undertook three years ago is now proving to keep the electricity bill to a manageable level.
- The defibrillator cabinet has been installed in the renovated kiosk in New Brighton, and the device has now arrived, and will be installed in the next couple of days.
- The community council has one vacancy for a councillor. Anyone interested in the position can get information about what is involved from the Clerk, or
